

GENERAL RULES & CONDITIONS of ENTRY

All entries are accepted only upon the terms of the general rules and conditions below. Your signature on the entry form shall be deemed to be an acceptance of the rules and conditions.

The judges' decisions are final.

In the event of cancellation of this event £2 shall be retained per competitor to cover administrative expenses.

Health & Safety – The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards.

Disclaimer of Liability – Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor the British Horse Society, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, vehicles, land or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.

Protective Headwear must be worn at all times by anyone, whether or not a competitor, riding anywhere at a BRC event. Harnesses must be correctly adjusted and fastened. "Protective Headwear" constitutes a hat which meets one of the following standards.

British PAS 015, BSEN1384 Provided BSI Kitemarked or SEI

European EN1384 Provided BSI Kitemarked or SEI

American All All SEI ASTM 95, ASTM F1163, SNELL E2001

Australian & New Zealand All SAI AS/NZS 3838 Failure to do so

will incur elimination. Skull cap hats must be worn with a silk which may be coloured for cross-country competitions.

Cross Country Phase: Body Protectors & Medical Armbands are compulsory; **Stopwatches** are not permitted.

Lorries and trailers must be parked in an orderly fashion in the designated parking areas only. Cars may not be parked in the lorry park.

Dogs must be kept on leads at all times. Borde Hill is a Shooting Estate

Scoring Enquiries or Objections must be made by a Club's Chef d'Equipe, Chairman or authorised representative.

COMPETITOR INFORMATION

Starting Times: All times will be available on www.brcarea10.org.uk from 6.00pm on Thursday 7th July.

Withdrawals/Team Changes: Must be made in writing or by email before 10.00am on Friday 8th July except in exceptional circumstances. **Changes after 17.00 on 8th July must be made at the competition before the appropriate class starts.**

Walking the Course: The course will be available for walking on Saturday, 9th July between 14:00 & 18.00. Please use the entrance from Borde Hill Gardens **Saturday only.** The Park will be locked at 18.00.

Equine Influenza Certificate: All BRC Qualifier competitors must have an up to date Equine Influenza Certificate, which must, under penalty of elimination, accompany the horse to this competition. The competitor is responsible for producing it when collecting their number insert.

A photocopy must be sent to the Entries Secretary with the Official Entry Form. Photocopies need not be sent for any horse confirmed as listed in the Area 10 Database 2011.

Membership Cards: To be produced when collecting number insert.

Horse-box Sign: Please clearly display an A4 sign inside the windscreen of your vehicle with your Club Name; your Name & contact number for the day. This so we can contact you in an emergency.

Club Helpers: It shall be a condition of entry that all Clubs entering supply 1 names, email address and telephone numbers of two people per team or five individuals (preferably experienced) who would be willing to jump judge or, some role, help the organising team. These volunteers must be told in advance by their clubs that they will be expected to **help all day** and will be informed of their duties by the event organiser, in the week prior to the competition. A form attached and can also be downloaded from the Area 10 website www.brcarea10.org.uk. This form must be enclosed with the area entry. If Club volunteers do not fulfil their duties, their Club's riders will not be allowed to continue in the competition.

Please make sure all BRC Competitors get a copy of the schedule.

DIRECTIONS: Borde Hill Gardens is signposted with brown signs from Cuckfield and Haywards Heath. In the immediate vicinity of the event, please follow the Borde Hill Horse Trials signs. Horse-boxes must use the entrance from Hanlye Lane; Cars must use the main Borde Hill Gardens entrance.
